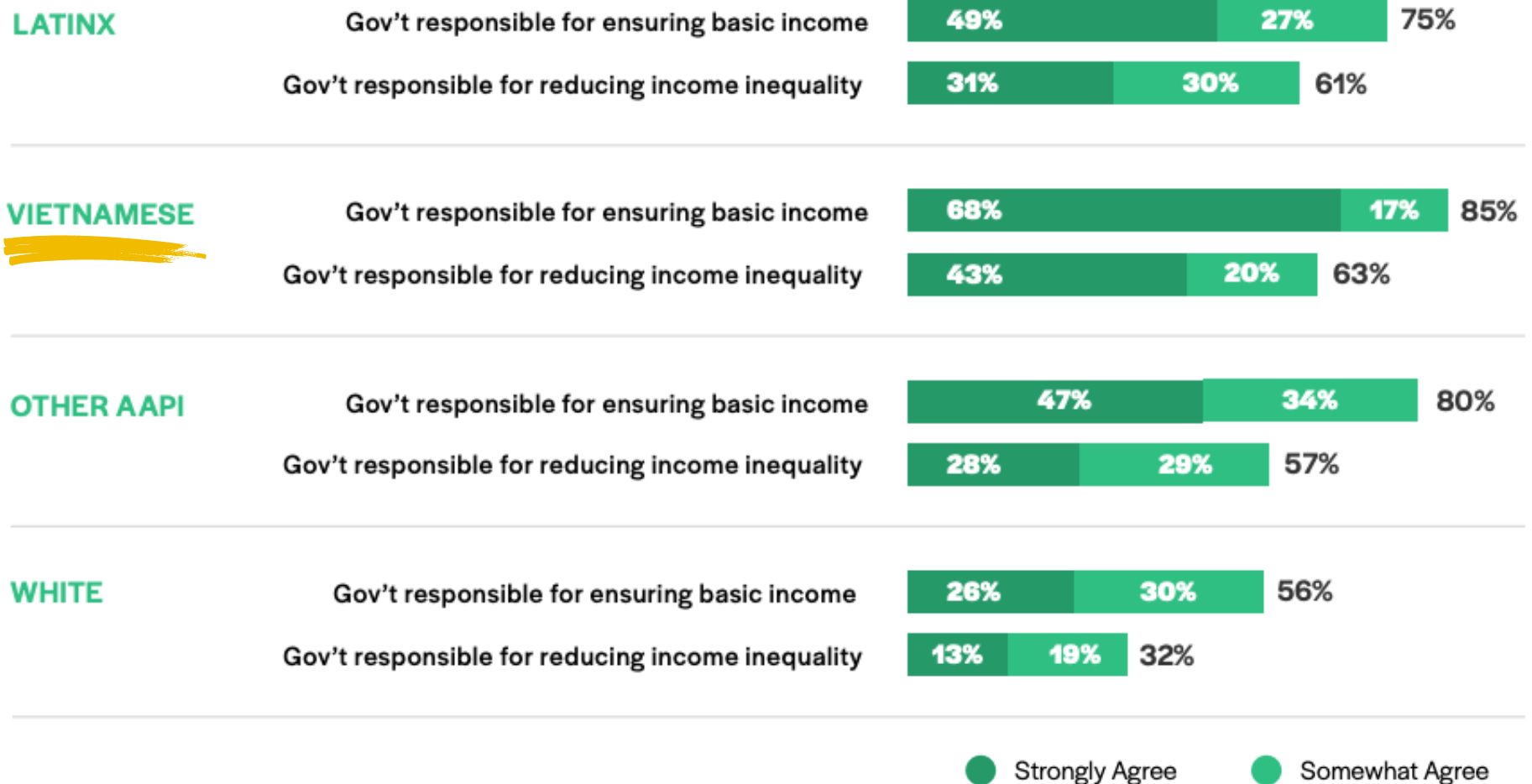




OBI's survey of Orange County, CA found that **Vietnamese residents are more likely than any other group to support economic redistributive policies.**

Though the Vietnamese community is often depicted as politically polarized, **independents account for more than a third of registered Vietnamese voters in Orange County.**



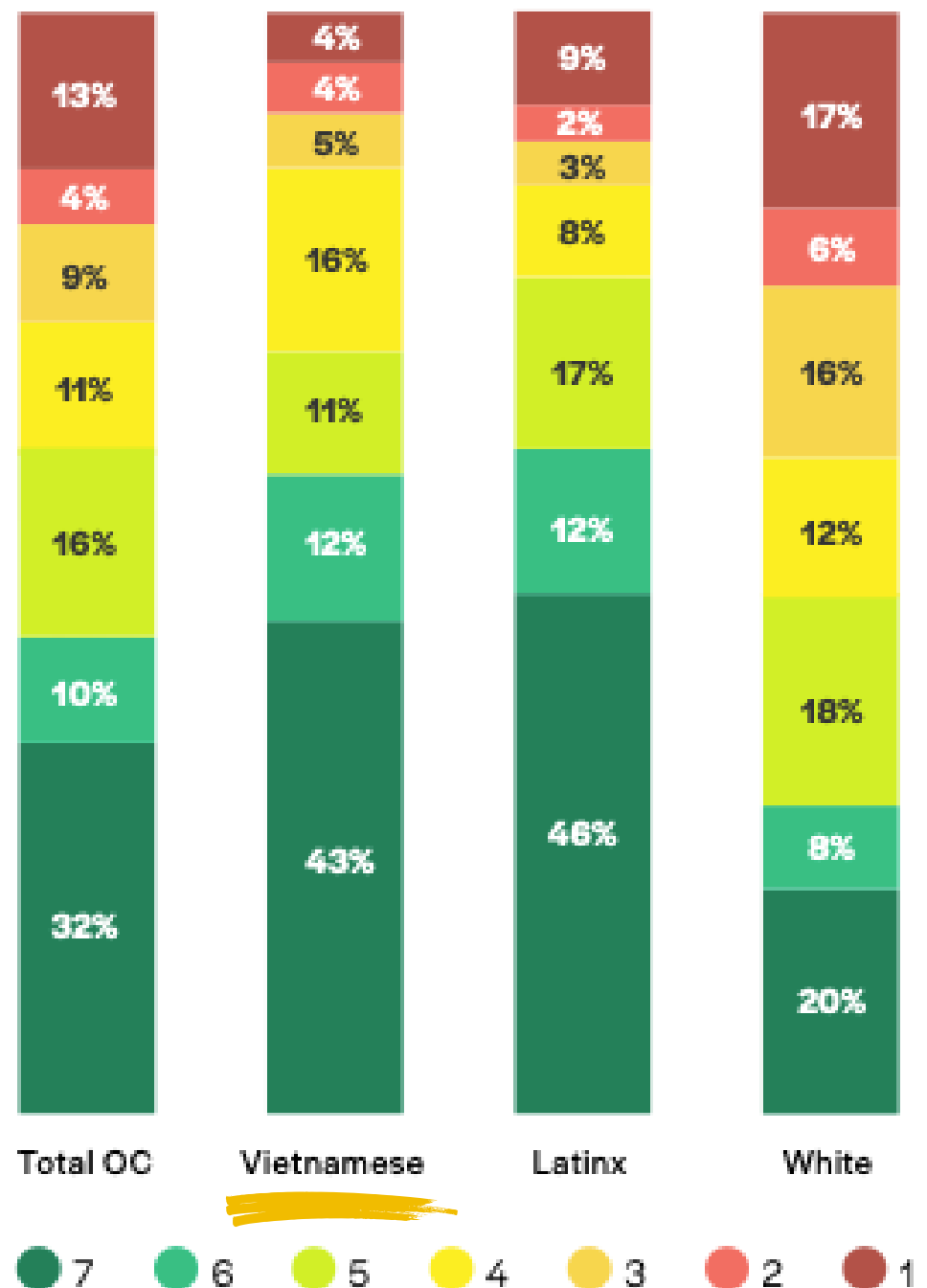
With this in mind, although the most partisan voices are often heard loudest, **this independent group represents the community's true 'center of gravity'.**
